Reminders (Declamation):

- Declamation is a speech made to an audience. It is a precursor for original oratory.
- Do not look at the judge.
- Refrain from being a cadaver --- keep a lively face.

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- Do not use gestures as a means to fill space.
- Excessive gestures will lose your points.
- In declamation, you are allowed to walk in your performance area, so take advantage of this, to accentuate what you are saying.
- 3 to 4 strong movements are really all you need. In most declamation
 pieces, the speaker must start at the center, go left or right, move
 left or right, back at the center then down toward the audience for
 the conclusion.
- Your movement on a new point acts as a transition and breaks up / punctuates your speech.
- This transition keeps your speech fresh and draws in your audience because movement is exciting and full of energy.

Grade 8 - JAZZ CHANT

- Uniform piece -- (Do you like this ?)
- Time Limit 3-5 minutes
- Note to the teacher-trainers you can repeat some words or lines twice or thrice
- Avoid using musical instruments; you are only allowed to use human emitted sounds.

- Each competing team will recite two (2) pieces.
 - The first is a WARM-UP PIECE in the mother tongue depict-

ing the culture of the area.

- The second is the CONTEST PIECE, "Do you like this?..."

is 3-5 minutes; however, the warm-up piece is NOT to be rated.

GUIDELINES IN RADIO BROADCASTING

- 1. Each school MUST ORGANIZE a radio broadcasting team with seven (7) members. For elementary level, the participants can be chosen from grade 4 to grade 6. For the secondary level, the participants may come from all grade levels (Grade 7 to Grade 10).
- 2. For the school level competition, you may have several groups to allow maximum participation among students.---as this is the ultimate goal of the school level competition.
- A broadcast room for the presentation shall be prepared. Only the contestants, judges
 and the members of the contest committee shall be allowed inside.
- Prepare a quality sound system to ensure quality audio output. In case of power failure,
 Affected shall be allowed to perform again.
- Loud speakers shall be set outside the broadcast room.
- 6. Each team shall be given eight minutes; two (2) minutes of which for preparation, five (5) minutes for actual broadcast and one (1) minute for exit. This provided running time shall be applied.
- 7. A wall clock or timer must be provided, which shall serve as the official time that can be seen by the contestants and the judges . There will be an official time keeper.
- 8. A YELLOW FLAGLET shall be raised to signal the team that they have one (1) minute left for preparation. The GREEN FLAGLET shall be raised to signal the team to start. The YELLOW FLAGLET shall be raised again to warn the team that they only have one (1) minute remaining and followed by the RED FLAGLET to indicate that their time is UP!
- 9. The seven (7) members of the broadcasting team have specific roles . These are :

Anchors ----- 2 members News presenters ----- 2 members

GENERAL GUIDELINES: (For Grades 3,4 & 7)

EASY CATEGORY (Written)

- The Spelling Bee Master will say the word twice. The words will not be used in a sentence.
- 2. The contestants will write their answers on a tug board / bondpaper (one- half of it, lengthwise).
- 3. Each correctly spelled word earns one (1) point.
- 4. A bell must be provided to signal time limit.
- 5. The contestant must not be facing the audience.

AVERAGE CATEGORY (Written)

- 1. The Spelling Bee Master will say the word with definitions in three options given.
- 2. The contestant is expected to spell the given word and she is also expected to choose one (1) definition from among the three choices (A. ----, B.----, C. -----) given by the spelling Bee Master orally. The contestant will just say the letter of the correct answer
- 3. If the contestant cannot spell the given word correctly, but he is able to give the letter of the correct definition of the word, he earns one (1) point.
- 4. If the contestant correctly spells the word, but he is not able to give the correct letter of the correct definition of the word, he earns one (1) point.
- 5. If the contestant correctly spells the word, and he is able to give the correct letter of the correct definition of the word. He earns two (2) points.

DIFFICULT CATEGORY (ORAL)

- 1 This time, the contestants must face the audience.
- 2 A crystal bowl must be provided ., where the spelling words are to be placed .
- 3 The contestant must pick one rolled paper with a word written on it.
- 4 The contestant then spells the word after opening the rolled paper .
- 5 After he spells the word, he must use it in a meaningful sentence.
- 6 If the word is correctly spelled, but the sentence is NOT MEANINGFUL; ---- the contestant earns only one (1) point.
- 7 If the word is incorrectly spelled ., but the sentence is meaningful;---- still the contestant earns one (1) point.
- 8 If the contestant spells the word correctly and is able to use it in a meaningful sentence ---- the contestant earns three (3) points.
