 - Implemented for the last three years (i.e SY 2018-2019 to present):
 - Recently concluded project or
 - On-going projects
 - The Project shall be under in any of the six categories of this Awards.
- The Project/Program Entries shall be submitted to the District Level Screening Committee for evaluation and recommendation. Only Three (3) Project entries shall be nominated and submitted to the Congressional District Screening Committee on December 18, 2020.
- The District nominated entries will be screened by the Congressional District Screening Committee. They are to select the two (2) best project entries with video presentation of 3-5 minutes showcasing their projects based on the criteria for judging on or before January 8, 2021.
- The six (6) selected best project finalists will prepare video presentation of 3-5 minutes showcasing their projects based on the criteria for judging.
- The six (6) best program entries will be further screened at the Division Level. Division Level Screening and Awards Committee shall check, review and evaluate project entries and shall perform field validation if necessary. The Division Awards Committee shall inform the winning Project Entries via call or email on January 15, 2021.
- Awarding Ceremony will be announced later.
- All decisions of the Division Level Screening and Awards Committee are final. No correspondence pertaining to these decisions shall be entertained.
