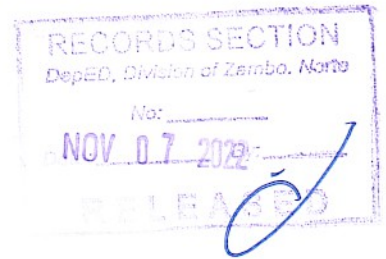

## Partnership Agreement

### Article 1 Definitions

1. UNISA refers to United Nations Student Association Maastricht VAK No. 14781095.
2. Saceda Youth Lead refers to the non-profit organization registered in Dumaguete City, Philippines.
3. The Parties refers to UNISA and Saceda Youth Lead.
4. The Agreement refers to this accord, concluded between the parties.

### Article 2 Scope of the Agreement

This agreement is to be concluded between the Development Committee of the UNISA and Saceda Youth Lead. The aim of the agreement is for the Development Committee to support Saceda Youth Lead by raising awareness, collecting funds and potentially sending volunteers or interns.

### Article 3 Obligations of the Parties

1. The Development Committee of UNISA Maastricht commits to:
  1. Raising awareness about Saceda Youth Lead's work and cause by promoting Buena Onda amongst its members, through internal communication and presentations;
  2. Offering monetary support through a fundraising project;
  3. Promoting Saceda Youth Lead on Instagram with a dedicated post announcing the partnership and volunteering/internship opportunities.
2. Saceda Youth Lead commits to:
  1. Guaranteeing a spot for UNISA volunteers/interns depending on its capabilities and availability;
  2. Supporting UNISA volunteers before and during their project;
  3. Sending UNISA information regarding the organization and volunteering/internship opportunities;
  4. Providing UNISA with visual material which will be used for promotion.

### Article 4 Good faith

All obligations set out in this agreement must be performed in good faith. Any such detrimental, or defaming use of one of the party's material or branding is forbidden. Thus, parties are prohibited from engaging in any behavior which would make the carrying out of the agreed partnership futile. Parties are forbidden to enact any detrimental measure that would make it impossible to carry out the purpose of this partnership.  
No partner shall use the other partner's name for no other than the partnership purposes.

### Article 5 Compensation

No compensation, neither financial nor other, may be asked from either party to perform the services mandated by this agreement.

### Article 6 Liability

This agreement does not entail liability of any kind, for both parties. No damages can be claimed on the basis of this agreement.

### Article 7 Duration

This agreement will come into force the moment it is signed by both parties and shall be in force for one year.

### Automatic Renewal

The agreement shall be automatically renewed each year, unless any of the parties gives written notice to the other to not automatically renew this agreement, prior to the expiration date of the respective term.

### Article 8 Termination

This agreement can be terminated at any time upon agreement of the parties in written notice. In the eventuality that a party fails to fulfil its obligations under this agreement, the other party can unilaterally terminate this agreement provided a written notice of twenty days.

### Article 9 Interpretation

This agreement of partnership shall be binding upon the respective successors, executors, trustees, administrators and representatives of the parties.  
The parties provide that this agreement shall be understood as undertaken on behalf of the respective conferences, and not privately between the signatories.
